HISTORY:

Founded in 1904 in Philadelphia as one of the nation's first cancer hospitals, then called American Oncologic Hospital (AOH), Fox Chase was also among the first institutions to be designated a National Cancer Institute Comprehensive Cancer Center in 1974. The Center was formed earlier that year by the union of AOH and the Institute for Cancer Research (founded in 1927). Today, Fox Chase conducts a broad array of nationally competitive basic, translational, and clinical research, with special programs in cancer prevention, detection, survivorship, and community outreach.

23RD ANNUAL HIGHLIGHTS OF THE SAN ANTONIO BREAST CANCER SYMPOSIUM

PILOT RESEARCH FUNDS: Named pilot funds can be directed to support a specific research or clinical area or endow a fellowship, speakership or lectureship.

EDUCATION FUNDS: Named education funds provide the opportunity for staff such as nurses and fellows to attend conferences and continuing medical education courses.

SOCIAL WORK FUNDS: Fox Chase social workers rely on social determinants of care to assess the needs of patients, including access to reliable transportation and food insecurity. Contributions to funds like these can be set up and managed by the Social Work team.

COMBATING CANCER THROUGH YOUR KITCHEN: Research has proven that both plant-based and Mediterranean diets may enhance cancer treatment and recovery by providing health benefits, supporting the body's natural defenses, and reducing the risk of several types of cancer. Nutrition intervention during cancer treatment can prevent malnutrition, loss of muscle mass, and is associated with fewer-treatment-related side effects, fewer hospitalizations, and improved quality of life. Philanthropic funding can support a six-week shared medical group led by Registered Dietitians and medical providers with a focus on hands-on nutrition education and medical support. Topics include symptom management, increasing calories and protein, maintaining a healthy body weight and more. Your support will help patients learn how to tolerate cancer treatment through healthy eating.

STEM EDUCATION FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS: The Teen Research Internship Program (TRIP) is a rigorous lab-based course for high school students who are motivated to explore their interests in science, technology, engineering, art, and math (STEAM). The mission of TRIP is to foster an enthusiasm for science by offering students a chance to do hypothesis-driven research and hands-on learning in a lab. The program is offered at two locations in the Greater Philadelphia region. TRIP is a recognized Educational Improvement Organization (EIO) under the Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) program of the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development.
